Because your doctor has given you PROPULSID®, it is **important** that you inform all health care professionals of all the other medications you are currently taking. You will need to show it to any doctor who prescribes a new medication for you, as well as to your pharmacist when you have a new prescription filled. This is to make sure that there is no interaction between PROPULSID® and other medications.
